These are the most important questions to ask during your assessment to ensure you're buying from a company that you can trust will look after you and your lift for it's entire lifespan.

There is one extra question that we recommend asking yourself once a surveyor has attended your home, that is "Did I feel pressured into buying a lift from this person?". We never want customers to feel pressured into a purchase and believe that everyone should be allowed time and space to decide if a company or lift is right for them. You can rest assured that we will never pressure you into a purchase, because we do not employ 'commission-only' sales people.

- Manufacturers vs. Authorised Dealers: Manufacturers will only offer their lift brand. This means that
 there will be fewer models options available to you and other lift companies may be unable to repair or
 service your lift for you. Few manufacturers sell directly to customers, while most sell through dealers
 only, giving you the choice to decide which lift is going to best suited to your home and your needs.
 Authorised dealers sell a number of different makes and models and have been approved by the
 manufacturers themselves to sell their product.
- Local Authority Suppliers: Local Authorities have an approved list of contractors that they deem reputable and trustworthy. They will recommend these to people who get in touch querying their options.
- Which? Trusted Traders: Trusted Traders is an endorsement scheme where traders must pass a rigorous assessment to ensure they are reputable and trustworthy. All Trusted Traders have annual checks to ensure they are still adhering to Which?'s Code of Conduct, not only this but all Which? reviews are verified from genuine customers.
- **BHTA Members:** The BHTA is a non-profit healthcare trade association, whose aim is to improve industry standards and consumer protection. Members must adhere to a strict Code of Practice to qualify which proves they have the customers' best interests at heart.
- Manufacturer Trained: It's important that any engineer who installs or services a lift is qualified on that specific make and model.
- **Project Managing Building Works:** If you have a installed, there are occasionally building or utility works that need to be carried out in ensure a safe installation. These could include fitting a power point for your lift to plug into, moving a radiator or building an infill step.
- **24/7 Callout Cover:** By choosing a company with 24/7 callout cover, including evenings, weekends and bank holidays, you can rest assured that if your lift has a breakdown, you will never be left for long. We recommend looking for a business where you will be put straight through to a qualified engineer when you call out of hours, as opposed to a call centre.
- **Showrooms:** If you're unsure about what a stairlift will look like in your home, how one works, or which will be best suited to your needs, we highly recommend visiting a showroom to try out a lift for yourself. They give great insight into how they can fit into your lifestyle, giving you the independence you need to stay in the home you love.
